Re: Police and Crime Panel Report of the PCC Proposed Precept 2018/19 and Medium Term Financial Strategy

Thank you for the report on my proposed precept and medium term financial strategy as discussed at the Police and Crime Panel on the 31st January 2018.

The priority for my 2018 /19 budget and precept was to provide the Chief Constable with an appropriate level of resource to deliver the priorities of my Police and Crime Plan whilst allocating additional funding to support:

- 24 additional Police Officers across the eight neighborhood policing areas
- Four additional staff to provide support to rape and modern day slavery investigations
- Increased resources to support the drive for a representative workforce.

I believe that my precept proposal meets these priorities and I am delighted that the public have given me their support (through the recent consultation) to do so.

I should like to take the opportunity to thank the Police and Crime Panel for their unanimous support of my second precept proposal which, I believe, will set a strong financial foundation for policing in Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland.
