Title: Laptop replacement capital funding

Summary of Issue:

The force has 803 old laptops that must be re-built to remain secure and able to operate on the new 365 platform. To do so will be time consuming, inconvenient for officers, staff and IT and will only be utilised for the remaining period of usage of the laptop (up to 12 months maximum expected use).

IT would like to bring forward the planned and budgeted spend into the 2020/21 financial year and replace the old devices earlier. This will reduce the time taken to rebuild the laptops, limit contact risk during Covid and any adverse impact on operational availability of officers and staff.

The table below shows the impact of bringing forward the capital spend into 2020/21. The additional cost will be funded through slippage in other projects from 2020/21 to 2021/22. There is no overall cost increase in the capital programme for the period 2020/22. The revenue impact is also cost neutral for 2020/21.

The key risks that are mitigated by the proposed change in bringing forward replacement are...

- Reduces risk of failing to meet the out of support deadline for windows
 7 devices of 31 March 2021.
- Reduces risk of delays in delivering 365 across the organisation which is dependent on the appropriate windows 10 build.
- The proposed change has fewer risks than the current planned process and is effectively a mitigation for the original plan which has been placed in jeopardy by issues with the deployment of the windows 10 devices.

Recommendation(s) presented:

Bring forward the replacement of 803 laptops in 2021/22, funded by slippage in the capital programme for 2020/21. This has significant operational benefits in reducing down time and impact on IT resources, and reduces contact touch points reducing the associated Covid risks, with no overall cost increase for the period 2020/22.
