1) When & where did it take place?

The meeting took place on Friday 4th November 2022. The meeting was requested by Dr Luke Evans MP as a catch up with what policing priorities the local Neighbourhood Policing Area (NPA) has for Hinckley and Bosworth, but also to raise specific issues troubling Dr Luke's constituents.

The meeting took place Dr Luke's constituency office.

2) How long did it last?

The meeting lasted an hour.

3) Who else was in attendance?

Mr Matthews and Dr Luke.

4) What record is there of what was discussed/agreed?

The topics covered in the meeting were as follows:
