In light of the current situation surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic the statutory audit deadline for 2019/20 for all local authorities in England (excluding the health service) has been extended. This is to give authorities more flexibility, time to adjust to new working practices and adapt to the changes faced in these unprecedented times. The date at which the annual accounts need to be published has moved from the 31 July to 30 November. The public inspection period must take place on or before the first working day of September 2020.

NOTICE is given that from 1 September 2020 to 12 October 2020 inclusive, between 10.00am and 4.00pm (Monday to Friday) any interested party may inspect, and make copies of, the accounts of:

- the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner for Leicestershire; and/or
- the Office of the Chief Constable for Leicestershire; and/or
- the group accounts for the year ended 31 March 2019;

and the books, deeds, contracts, bills, vouchers, receipts and other documents relating to them. The accounts and other documents will be available for inspection at Police Headquarters, St Johns, Enderby, Leicester, LE19 2BX.

During this period a local government elector (or their representative) may question the auditor about the accounts or make an objection to the accounts as set out in sections 26 and 27 of the Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014.
