

- Rural Policing a rural police presence tackling the crimes affecting rural communities.


With your support I have set a budget that will enable the Chief Constable to make these improvements. I will monitor the progress against your priorities every step of the way on your behalf.

#### THE COST OF YOUR POLICE

The budget has been set at £223.2m for 2022-23. The amount you will pay towards policing in 2022-23 depends on the property in which you live. The average (Band D) household will pay an extra 19p a week through the small part of the council tax bill that goes towards policing.
