Title: Police and Crime Commissioner Partner Funding:

Summary of Issue:

For 2013/14 the Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) received £1.65m through the PCC Community Safety Fund (CSF) from the Home Office to fund initiatives that would contribute to achieving the Strategic Priorities within the Police and Crime Plan. This funding was previously distributed to partners via a number of Home Office specific grants including:

- 1. Community Safety Fund
- 2. Drug Intervention Programme
- 3. Community Safety Partnership
- 4. Youth Crime and Substance Misuse
- 5. Positive Futures
- 6. Communities against guns, gangs & knives programme
- 7. Innovation Fund
- 8. Safer Future Communities

To ensure that all partnership funding was identified and to reduce the risk of duplicate funding, the CSF has been amalgamated with funding historically used by the Leicestershire Police to fund specific initiatives with partners to give a total funding pot of £2.9m.

During the development of the Police and Crime Plan (PCP), it was recognised that to support the achievement of the Themes and Strategic Objectives within the Police and Crime Plan a commissioning framework needed to be developed. This would underpin how the Police and Crime Commissioner would commission outcomes.

To enable the Commissioning Intentions to be developed and in recognition of partner feedback that they would need to plan for the outcomes of the Commissioning Intentions and change in the way outcomes are to be delivered, the funding has been split into a number of streams:

- 1. Initiatives that were historically funded through Home Office Grants Allocate 6 months funding at 2012/13 levels (funding up to end of September 2013).
- 2. Previous Leicestershire Police funded initiatives funded at either 2012/13 levels or pre-agreed arrangements (funding up to 31st March 2014).
- 3. Funding to both City and County Basic Command Units (BCU) to fund emerging issues at a local level (£100k to each BCU).

4. Continuation of allocations to the Leicestershire to ensure contribution to partner initiatives are maintained (funding up to 31st March 2014).

The Police and Crime Plan was published on 31st March 2013. This enabled the Commissioning intentions to be published on 21st June 2013.

The Commissioning Intentions were developed after engagement with various partners. This helped to identify the commissioning avenues available to the Police and Crime Commissioner and the partners' ability to deliver the outcomes to contribute to the achievement of the strategic priorities. As a result of this engagement the following purchasing systems (with proposed funding allocated to each) were established within the Commissioning Intentions, which aim to deliver outcomes that support the themes and objectives within the Police and Crime Plan.

- Direct Commissioning Directly tender or contract under a single tender dispensation;
- 2. Co-Commissioning with existing Commissioners under a "Contract" i.e. ask existing Commissioners to commission outcomes on the behalf of the PCC under a contract;
- Co-Commissioning with Community Safety Partnerships at City, County, Rutland and District level under a contract based on business cases presented and agreed;
- 4. Issuing funds via a new PCC Grant, inviting any provider or providers to submit applications against a set of criteria;
- Awarding funding via a new Innovation Fund, inviting any provider or providers to propose and work on new and innovative solutions for "testing" against Plan priorities and outcomes, not otherwise described in his Commissioning Plans;
- Allocating via the BCU Fund this is a continuation of the model whereby the BCU Commanders have a fund which they can use flexibly to meet local need/demand.

As a result of the above purchasing systems within the Commissioning Intentions, the attached schedule shows the proposed allocations for the funding through each process and how they link to the themes within the Police and Crime Plan.

The funding of the above proposals (and those within the attached schedule) are as follows:

^{*} In May 2013, the Police and Crime Commissioner announced that he intended to allocate an additional £1m over the next 3 years to boost the commissioning budget. This funding is to be allocated from the Budget Equalisation Reserve. The table

above shows a proportion of this funding is proposed to be used in 2013-14 to support prevention and early intervention initiatives.

The processes for allocating the Community Safety Fund and the PCC Grant were undertaken in July/August 2013. These were as follows:

Community Safety Fund:

The Community Safety Partnerships (CSP) were requested to submit business cases to the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner. The business cases submitted by the Districts were forwarded to Leicestershire Safer Communities Senior Officer Group to enable an independent assessment and recommendations to be presented to the Police and Crime Commissioner. The business cases submitted by Leicester City and Rutland County Council were assessed by members of staff from the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner. Summaries of the business cases and recommendations were presented to the Police and Crime Commissioner for approval.

PCC Grant:

Submissions via application, were invited from all interested parties and in total 33 applications were received. In order to engage partners in the funding process and to instil a degree of independence into the decision making process the following process was adopted:

- A number of people from various organisations and with expertise covering the Police and Crime Plan Themes were approached to assess the application forms (score the responses). They provided recommendations and feedback on the applications allocated to them. These were known as the "Themed Reviewers"
- A "Review Panel" was established whose membership consisted of representatives from the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner, Force, Leicestershire County Council, Leicester City Council, Rutland County Council, Probation and the Third Sector. The remit of the Panel was to make recommendations to the Police and Crime Commissioner on which proposals to fund. This would be on the basis of the scores, comments and recommendations of the "Themed Reviewers".
- The recommendations of the "Review Panel" were presented to the Police and Crime Commissioner for approval.

Recommendations presented:

- 1. Approve the funding allocations and distributions set out in Table 1 (attached).
- 2. Approve the use of the Budget Equalisation Reserve to support the commissioning intentions and the Police and Crime Plan.

Key discussion points at meeting

During 2013 a series of meetings and discussions have taken place with various partners and bodies to determine how funding should be allocated and what approaches to commissioning to be undertaken by Police and Crime Commissioner can be adopted. These include meetings of the Strategic Partnership Board and various meeting and discussions with officers at various levels within Leicester City Council, Leicestershire County Council, Rutland County Council, Probation Service and various voluntary sector organisations.

The key discussion points were:

- 1. How to allocate the PCC community Safety Funding, whilst taking into consideration:
 - · Previous funding received by partners from the Home Office.
 - The impact to partners of potential funding changes.
 - · Partners delivering on outcomes not services.
 - Partners Planning for the outcomes of the Commissioners Intentions
 - The Themes and Strategic Priorities within the Police and Crime Plan
- 2. How the Police and Crime Plan can be supported through the commissioning intentions.
- 3. The commissioning purchasing systems which could be adopted to support both the Police and Crime Plan and the Commissioning Intentions.
- 4. How to encourage partners to present original innovative ideas which would allow the PCC to gain maximum impact for the resources that are available.

It was resolved that:

The recommendations set out above be accepted and implemented to support both the Police and Crime Plan and the Commissioning Intentions.
