**Title: Body Worn Video Investment** 

### **Summary of Issue:**

Body Worn Video (BWV) is recognised by Leicestershire Police as a vital resource that has been implemented and used to great effect in operational policing.

The first purchase of BWV equipment was purchased in part due to a successful bid by Leicestershire to the national innovation fund. The following year, a successful Regional innovation bid enabled the force to increase their equipment further, with the added benefit of ensuring the most up to date equipment, consistent across the Region and Regional collaboration teams. Due to the demands of front line use, natural attrition and developments in technology, the force have reviewed their BWV stocks and allocated clear ownership of this equipment moving forwards.

Almost half of the current stock is from the initial innovation fund purchase and is end of life, the warranty is no longer applicable and these devices need replacement. Additionally, given the benefits of these devices for operational policing, new departmental needs for these devices have been identified and sound business cases produced. Furthermore, moving forwards a structured service plan to reduce service charges and ensure efficient cost effective resilience is required to be implemented by the Force.

By the time of the second round of BWV purchases form the Regional innovation bid, developments in the equipment led to a higher specification for the devices and consistency across the Region. The specification of these devices is still applicable at the current time.

In November 2016, the Change Board considered a detailed paper on the current BWV equipment; the status and requirements of the force's Body Worn Video equipment; replacement options and maintenance and Force ownership of equipment moving forwards.

The PCC and his CFO were in attendance at the meeting and significant scrutiny and challenge was applied to the paper by members of the Board present. The Board recognised the benefits of this equipment and acknowledged the improvements

required for ownership and maintenance programmes moving forwards.

Additional clarification was sought in the following areas from the Force which has now been received:

- 1. Potential costing options available the PCC has been advised that these are available until 31/12/16.
- Leicestershire's early adoption of the first release of the devices from the initial innovation fund enabled the Force to feedback improvements and developments and required innovation of the devices. This input helped shape the second release of devices which are used by the Region and Leicestershire.
- 3. The proposed replacement and increase in devices is consistent with the devices used in the Region, therefore ensuring coherence across the Region and Regional collaborations.
- 4. Departments not previously issued with BWV have put forward sound operational Business cases to the Force which are supported by the Change Board, chaired by the DCC.
- 5. There has been recognition of a service and maintenance package for these devices to ensure the maximum lifespan following the post warranty period. Budgetary provision is included for 17/18 to purchase the service credits that have been offered as part of this package.
- 6. The Head of Procurement has been consulted on the potential procurement and any queries raised by him before and at the Change Board have been addressed.
- 7. Other procurement options for similar devices have been reviewed, which are used in other national forces, but these have infrastructure, training and compatibility issues and the Force advise that the preferred option is to continue with the Reveal devices.
- 8. Whilst the Force has £68,000 of funding available for BWV for 2016/17, this is insufficient to meet the full costs of the request. Furthermore, the CFO has sought and received assurance from the Force Head of Finance that there will be additional provision for operational equipment replacements built into the budget moving forwards.

As at the 13/12/16, the Force requests funding from current year underspends within the Chief Constable's budget of £328,075 is used to procure replacement and additional devices. This comprises total cost of £396,075, which £68,000 is already set aside and provided for replacement in the Force 2017/18 budget.

Recommendations	presented:
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That the PCC approves the Force request for purchase of replacement and additional Body Worn Video equipment of £328,075 based on the operational case and requirements presented by the Force.
