Title: People Zones Round 1 Bell Foundry Successful Bids

Summary of Issue:

People Zones are locations with a boundary attached, that has been identified through crime and public health data. People Zones follow an Asset Based Community Development approach, which focuses on highlighting what assets are in the area and how we can help communities to build upon and enhance them. The hope is to empower residents and workers to work collaboratively to become a stronger, safer, and self-sustaining community. To be eligible to apply for People Zone funding, applicants must be living, working, or providing a service within a People Zone, and the project must meet one or more of the themes identified within the People Zones research report. This decision relates to the first round of funding ring fenced for the Bell Foundry people zone in 2023.

The Bell Foundry funding round opened on 30/01/2023 and closed on 27/02/2023. 5 applications were submitted during this time. Community Development Officers Lily Thorne and James O'Connell individually marked each application during the period 28/02/2023 - 07/03/2023, and then moderated their scores on 08/03/2023 under the supervision of Charlotte Highcock, Commissioning Manager. 1 application scored 60% or above, 1 application scored 50% or above, 2 applications scored 40% or above, and 1 application scored below 40%. Prior to evaluation, the decision was made to award those applications that scored 40% or above. However, following evaluation, it was agreed that the applications which scored less than 50% were not suitable for funding at this time, due to not aligning with the Bell Foundry themes, and concerns around risk and sustainability. The successful applications were presented to the PCC for final approval.

The PCC approved to fund 2 bids in this round. This equates to a funding commitment of £9,950.00.
