Title: **People Zones Grants Fund – Legacy Round**

---

### Decision summary:

This decision relates to the **Legacy** round of funding of the 2024-2025 financial year; ring fenced for People Zones.

This funding round opened on **01/09/2025** and closed on **10/10/2025**.

**10** applications were submitted during this time. Partnership & Commissioning Officers Lily Thorne and Oli Childerhouse graded each application and made recommendations for funding.

**3** applications scored 70% or above, **4** applications scored 60% or above and **3** applications scored 40% or above.

For this round, it was decided that applications scoring 65% and above would be awarded funding, providing all criteria is met. In this round, that resulted in **5** bids being recommended.

Upon review, the Senior Management Team approved to fund the recommended 5 bids. This equates to a funding commitment of £122,918.76.

People Zones are locations with a boundary attached, that has been identified through crime and public health data. People Zones follow an Asset Based Community Development approach, which focuses on highlighting what assets are in the area and how we can help communities to build upon and enhance them.

The hope is to empower residents and workers to work collaboratively to become a stronger, safer, and self-sustaining community. To be eligible to apply for People Zone funding, applicants must be living, working, or providing a service within a People Zone, and the project must meet one or more of the themes identified within the People Zones research report.

The grant funded projects seek to support the work of the People Zones project, as well as the objectives of the Police and Crime plan through a prevention perspective.

Projects focus on reducing and preventing crime by focussing on risk factors such as mental health and wellbeing, crime and safety, antisocial behaviour, drugs and alcohol misuse, engagement with children and young people, engagement with parents, diversionary activity and signposting opportunities for support.

### **4) Impact of not approving the application**

The People Zone communities will not be able to set up new projects with our support with the view to becoming self-sustaining in twelve months' time.

**£122,918.76** from the allocated People Zones budget.

In 2022, a community consultation was undertaken by a commissioned external provider called Mapping for Change. Data was collected from semi-structured interviews, informal conversations, online and paper surveys, workshops and focus groups. The views and opinions of residents and workers across the community have been collated into research reports, specific to each People Zone area. Through this, several key themes were identified for each area, which serve as the point of focus going forward. The People Zones Grants Fund stipulates that all projects must align with at least one key theme from their area, to ensure the projects are meeting the needs of the community.
